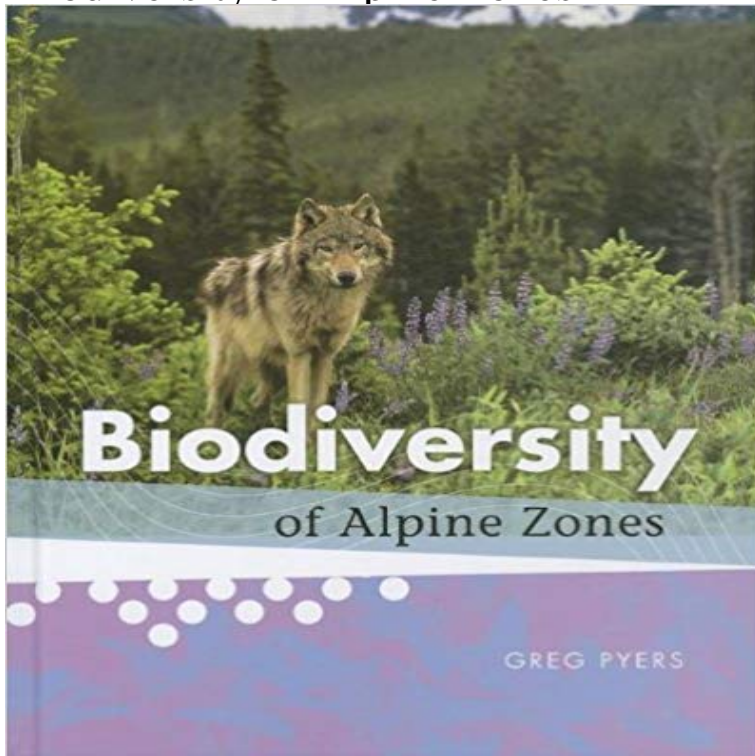

Alpine zones are habitats, which are places where animals and plants live. Within an alpine zone, there are many smaller habitats, sometimes called microhabitats.
