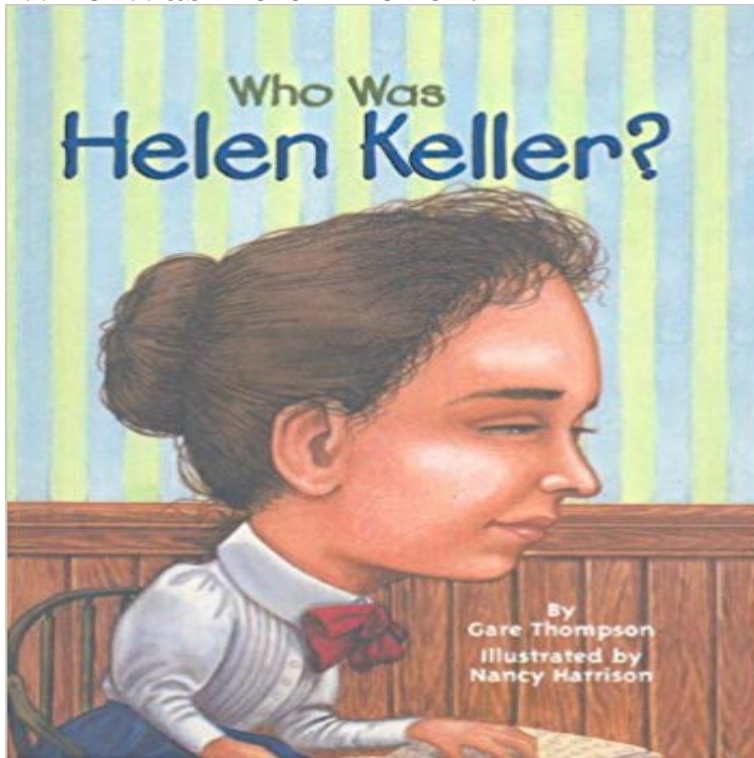


Who Was Helen Keller?
