

Did working hours become longer during the Industrial Revolution? Marx and EP Thompson said so, but there was no way to know. In this book, Hans-Joachim Voth examines this crucial issue using a novel set of sources - court records. Analysing witness accounts, he demonstrates that working hours increased markedly after 1750. The key reason is not that hours per day increased; instead, the number of holidays declined, and Monday became a regular working day.
