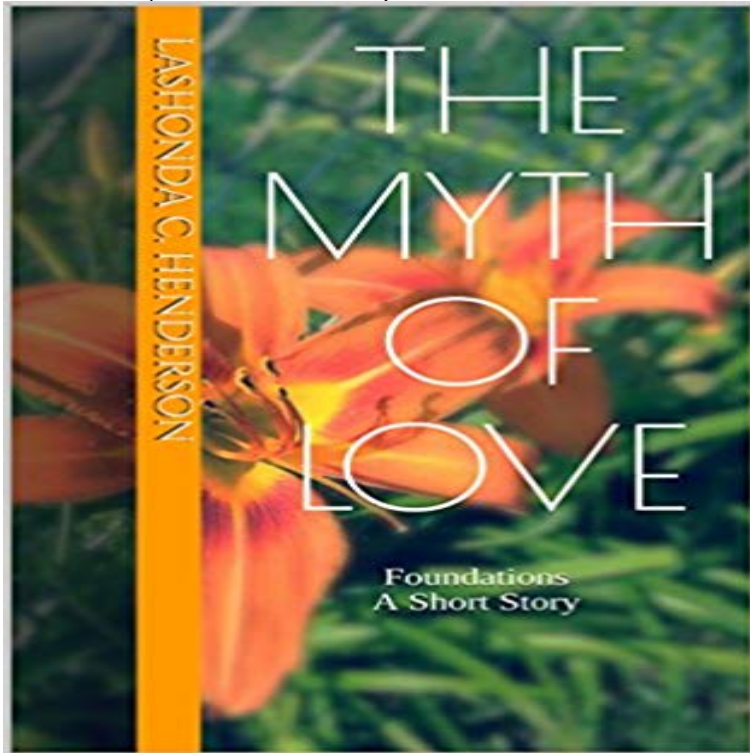


The Myth of Love (Foundations ~A Short Story Book 1)
