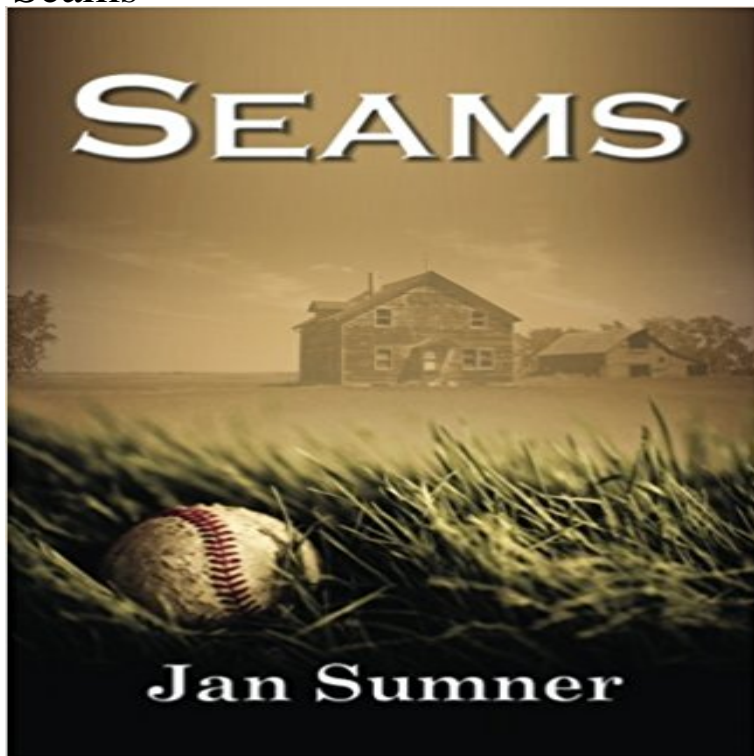


## Seams
