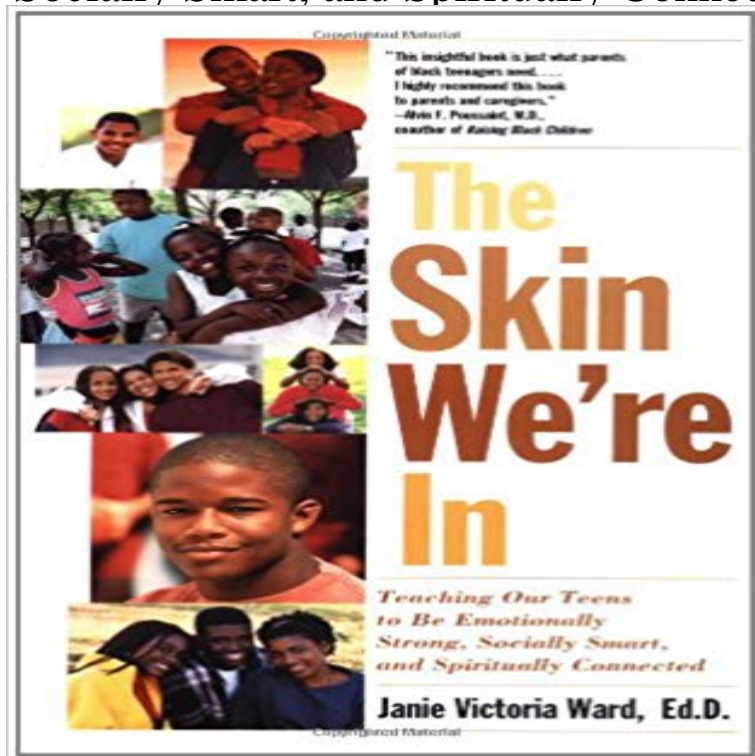


The Skin Were In: Teaching Our Teens To Be Emotionally Strong, Socially Smart, and Spiritually Connected
